## BENCHING TIMES

- All exhibits are to be benched (delivered to the Exhibition Hall) by 10.00am on Show Friday.
- Exhibits are to be removed between 4.00pm and 5.00pm on Show Saturday.
- If you are unable to attend at this time, please have someone collect for you (they need your entry form) or make arrangements with the Steward.
- Exhibits that are not collected by 5.00pm on Show Saturday will be disposed of.

## REGULATIONS

- All flowers and pot plants to be grown by the exhibitor in a private garden and are to be the property of the exhibitor, with the exception of floral art and weed arrangements.
- Exhibit cards must be attached to exhibit containers by rubber band or blu-tac. If known, please name cultivars.
- Exhibitors to supply their own containers for all sections Points are often awarded for the staging or display of exhibits.
- Exhibits may be disqualified if other than stated number of blooms shown or placed in wrong class.
- Specimen flowers must have their own stem and foliage. No stems longer than 70cm please. Pack the neck using kitchen towel or oasis so that the stem is held firm for judging and display purposes.
- In Part C, flowers should be on own foliage unless otherwise stated. Judging will be 50/50 for quality of flowers and for arrangement.

## DEFINITIONS

- 'Distinct' means not of the same variety - clearly different.
- 'Not Scheduled' means not already named in that section.
- HT means "hybrid tea"
- One 'cut' can have multiple flowers
- Specimens to be staged in separate bottles of appropriate size.
- For display purposes, a rose bud is such from the time the calyx opens and colour is visible, until the guard or outer petals open to not more than 45 degrees.

<u>Class</u>	<b>Part A. Roses (to be named if possible)</b>
F1	3 Roses in separate containers, not necessarily distinct, must be at the same stage of opening (not buds)
F2	1 bi colour or multi colour HT rose (half to fully open)
F3	1 Rose, red (half to fully open)
F4	1 Rose, pink (half to fully open)
F5	1 Rose, white or cream (half to fully open)
F6	1 Rose, yellow, gold, apricot (half to fully open)
F7	1 cut Cluster Rose (Floribunda)
F8	1 cut David Austin Rose
F9	1 cut Heritage Rose, named
F10	1 cut Miniature Rose, must be from a miniature rose bush
F11	Rose in Three Stages HT - same variety in separate containers: bud, partially open and full.
F12	1 cut any other Rose not scheduled
F13	Collection of Rosebuds (minimum 3, in vase)
<b>Part B. Specimens (1 flower) and Cut Flowers (can be multiple flowers)</b>	
F14	1 Gladioli
F15	2 Sweet Peas, distinct, 2 cuts each, separate containers
F16	1 (flower stem) Single Geraniums with separate own leaf
F17	1 (flower stem) Double Geraniums with separate own leaf
F18	1 (flower stem) Pelargonium with separate own leaf
F19	1 (flower stem) Ivy Geranium with separate own leaf
F20	4 Pansies, distinct, separate containers and collars
F21	1 cut Single Fuchsia
F22	1 cut Double Fuchsia
F23	1 cut flowering Shrub, Tree or Climber not included in schedule
F24	1 Bulb, Tuber or Rhizome
F25	1 any other flower not scheduled: stock, delphinium, larkspur etc, no laterals.
F26	1 cut foliage, tree or shrub (no seeds or flowers)
F27	1 cut bottlebrush
F28	1 cut any other Australian native not scheduled
F29	1 Protea, Leucadendron, Leucospermum
F30	1 Camellia flower floating in a bowl (no buds)
F31	1 carnation
F32	1 stem bearded Iris
<b>Part C. Decorative (formal, symmetrical when viewed from all sides)</b>	
<i>Maximum width of container to be 250mm diameter</i>	

F33.	Container of six roses Distinct
F34.	Container of Flowers, 1 variety not scheduled
F35.	Container of Mixed Flowers – minimum 3 varieties
F36.	Container of roses
F37.	Container of Marguerites
F38.	Container of Geraniums
F39.	Container of weed flowers and/or foliage
<b>Part D. Floral Art (Informal, creative)</b>	
F40.	Table Centre of Fresh Flowers, maximum height 25cm
F41.	Mixed ornamental foliage
F42.	Wedding arrangement
F43.	A picture made of dried materials (flowers, nuts, bark, leaves etc) on cardboard no larger than A4 size.
F44.	Australiana arrangement
<b>Part E. Pot Plants</b>	
<i>Pots not to exceed 300mm in Diameter. Foliage should not touch table, elevate on upturned matching pot if necessary.</i>	
F45.	Flowering pot plant, 1 variety (excluding orchids)
F46.	Foliage only pot plant, 1 variety
F47.	Fern, any, 1 variety
F48.	Single Cactus or Succulent
F49.	Single Carnivorous plant
F50.	Bromeliad (single or with attached offsets)
F51.	Pot of Flowering Bulbs - single or multiple
F52.	Window Box (up to 40cm long x 15cm wide) 1 or more varieties – flowering
F53.	Hanging basket or hanging container other than orchid(not exceeding 250mm diameter)
<b>Part F. Orchids</b>	
<i>Pots not to exceed 300mm in Diameter</i>	
F54.	Cymbidium, Standard
F55.	Cymbidium, Intermediate
F56.	Cymbidium, Miniature
F57.	Dendrobium
F58.	Any other Orchid
<b>Part G. Bonsai</b>	
<i>Containers are part of the exhibit and will be judged.</i>	
F59.	Small, single plant to 20cms height
F60.	Medium, single plant to 40cms height
F61.	Open
